ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN

- 1. The Republic of Mozambique (RoM) is planning to implement the Mozambique Northern Crisis Recovery Project (NCRP) for which it has requested support from the World Bank. The project will be coordinated by the Agency for Integrated Development of the North (ADIN), under the leadership of the Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development (MADER) and National Found for sustainable Development (FNDS) as fiduciary agency, with involvement of the following ministries and institutions: Ministry of Public Works, Housing and Water Resources (MOPHRH); Ministry of the Sea, Inland Waters and Fishers (MIMAIP); Ministry of Land and Environment (MTA); Ministry of Health (MISAU); Ministry of National Defence (MDN); Ministry of Interior (MINT); Ministry of Gender, Child and Social Action (MGCAS); State Secretariat for Youth (SEJE) and Employment and National Institute of Disaster Management (INGD).
- 2. The RoM will implement material measures and actions so that the project is implemented in accordance with the Environmental and Social Framework (ESF) of the World Bank. This Environmental and Social Commitment Plan (ESCP) sets out material measures and actions, any specific documents or plans, as well as the timing for completing them.
- 3. RoM will also comply with the provisions of any other E&S documents required under the ESF and referred to in this ESCP, such as Environmental and Social Management Plans (ESMP), Security Risk Assessment and Management Plan and Stakeholder Engagement Plan (SEP), and the timelines specified in those E&S documents.
- 4. The RoM is responsible for compliance with all requirements of the ESCP although implementation of specific measures and actions will be conducted by the Ministry, agency or unit referenced to in table 1.
- 5. Implementation of the material measures and actions set out in this ESCP will be monitored and reported to the Bank by RoM as required under the ESCP and the conditions of the grant agreement, and the Bank will monitor and assess progress and completion of the material measures and actions throughout implementation of the Project.
- 6. As agreed between the Bank and RoM, this ESCP may be revised from time to time during project implementation, to reflect adaptive management of project implementation changes and unforeseen circumstances or in response to assessment of project implementation performance conducted under the ESCP itself. In such circumstances, MADER will agree to the changes with the Bank and will update the ESCP to reflect such changes. Agreement on changes to the ESCP will be documented through the exchange of letters signed between the Bank and MADER. The MADER will promptly disclose the updated ESCP.
- 7. Where changes due to unforeseen circumstances, or project performance result in changes to the risks and impacts during implementation, RoM shall provide additional funds, if needed, to implement actions and measures to address such risks and impacts.
